Infrastructure

- Cadell Training Centre Team continued work on Gluepot track clearing, maintenance and building.
- The Reserve's solar power system was upgraded to provide double its' output. This required newer and larger batteries, additional panels and changes to control systems. The battery room was extended to cater to the new system.
- Quinn's Dam was cleaned out using a large front-end loader. This was undertaken by the Reserve's 'RAG'
 Construction Team (led by Reserve Committee member Bill Santos) and included the provision of a pre, silt
 collection dam and two 600mm pipes, to provide flow into the main dam. The dams' carrying capacity has now
 doubled.
- The Archaeology Department of the South Australian Museum, led by Curator Keryn Walshe, excavated the floor
 of the Old Gluepot Cellar, in preparation for its restoration by the Riverland 4WD Club. Keryn was assisted by
 Reserve volunteers.
- The 'RAG' Construction Team strengthened the rain catching roof over the Old Gluepot Tanks.
- The Cadell Training Centre Team built a wire fence around the Old Gluepot House to provide an added measure of protection to the site.

- Four fox baiting rounds were undertaken with two 10 day follow-ups being made to replace take-ups. Fox baiting is undertaken by Keith Bellchambers assisted by Wally Klau, both Reserve Committee members...
- Atlassing of 73 sites on Gluepot continues. Several Atlassing 'teams' have been formed that undertake to regularly Atlas at 'their' selected sites on a long-term basis.
- The Mallee Fire and Biodiversity project continued and field work concluded at the end of 2008.
- Surveys of Black-eared Miner colonies across Gluepot continue to be undertaken to determine what effect the Nov/Dec 2006 had on the species.
- A 'Post Fire' intensive bird banding project to determine movements of birds in and from the burnt areas continues. This will be a long-term project and involves participation of 'A' Class banders from a number of states.
- The SA Sporting Shooters Association continues to undertake responsibility for goat control on the Reserve and has 4-5 culls per year...
- Controlled burning continued on the Reserve for the second year in accordance with the Bookmark Mallee Fire Plan, produced by DEH. During the winter of 2008 the Fire Control Team, led by Reserve Committee member, Dennis Matthews, completed 32 km, utilising 23 volunteers for a total of 680 hours.
- The mallee fire control methodology adopted by Gluepot is recognised as the best available and a number of other Biosphere Land Partners were trained by the Reserve including DEH and CFS staff and fire control staff from NSW and Vic.
- A two day bat workshop, led by Reserve Committee member Dennis Matthews, was run for members of NRM and LAP groups.
- Two reptile honours projects and a PhD project on the Southern Scrub Robin commenced in 2008. The Scrub Robin project student was assisted by Reserve Banding Manager, Wally Klau.

Planning

- The Gluepot Reserve 2009 2013 Plan of Management was written by Belinda Cale and approved by the Reserve Management Committee
- The development and implementation of Research & Monitoring plans continued.
- Gluepot is now represented by Reserve Committee member Don Lill on the Birds Australia OH&S Committee

Policies and Marketing

- The Friends of Gluepot continued to strongly support the Reserve and conducted a number of working 'bees' at the Reserve and produced their first newsletter.
- 13 courses were run during the year in the new Environmental Education Centre 15,000 brochures were distributed advertising the courses. Some courses were over subscribed and extra sessions had to be run.
- The Reserve continued to feature in a large number of media articles, and on radio and television during the year.
- During October 2008, Birds Australia held their Congress at Waikerie and Campout at Gluepot.
- A policy for Commercial Tour Operators on Gluepot Reserve was formulated.
- The Reserve website received a major upgrade undertaken by Committee member, Peter Waanders.

GLUEPOT RESERVE MILESTONES YEAR: 2009

Infrastructure

- A Repeater Tower was erected and storage shed with a concrete base constructed to house UHF two way radio equipment for use between the base and vehicles on the reserve.
- The recycling shed was rebuilt and is now weather proof.
- Power lines to the research kitchen were upgraded in anticipation of the installation of air-conditioning.
- Water reticulation system was upgraded in the homestead area,
- The Gazebo at the Visitor Center was upgraded with a new roof and side panels reconstructed in corrugated iron to prevent termite attack.
- Air Conditioning was installed in the Ranger's House.
- Surveyor, Paul Tucker completed GPS mapping of services (water, power etc) and provided detailed plans of services for further use.
- Three stand alone camera systems were purchased for monitoring Malleefowl activity on mounds.
- Bait Stations were purchased and installed to provide termite protection to building infrastructure.
- A second hand 12 seater bus was purchased (from a donation) to assist with transporting groups around the Reserve such as attendees at Education centre courses.
- The Cadell Team continued its work of clearing the northern boundary in preparation for electrification of the 36 km fenceline – to restrict goat movement into the Reserve.

Research and Monitoring

- A 12 month trial installation of an ANABAT system was carried out to monitor movement of bats around the reserve.
- The Controlled Burning program was substantially completed with only 6 km of burn left to be completed.
- The fox baiting program continued with rangers carrying out two "follow up" rounds to replace bait take-ups.
- A six month trial investigation was undertaken on a proposal to use transmitter collars (Judas Goats) on goats as a method of locating and removing 'mobs' of animals.
- The Weed Management Program continued throughout the year with the old dam sites being specifically targeted.
- Didier le Goff (a French student under our Assistant Ranger Training Program) completed a comprehensive project entitled "Fire Management Plan 2009 at Birds Australia Gluepot Reserve".
- Feral Goat control continued throughout the year with the Sporting Shooters culling goats on two occasions.
- Monitoring of Malleefowl mounds by the Friends of Gluepot continued, to ensure identification of active mounds.

Planning

 The Plan of Management was updated to reflect assistance by Gluepot to the Black-eared Miner Recovery Team, monitoring of Malleefowl activity, identifying and monitoring Target Bird Species, identifying threatened plant species and re-defining vegetation mapping on the reserve.

- New signs were erected in the Homestead area.
- The Cadell Team continued track clearing of overhanging branches on internal tracks on the reserve.
- The bull nosed verandah addition to the Education Center was completed by the RAG Team.
- The Friends of the Botanic Gardens donated to Gluepot a display stand and a number of small desks.
- Two large screen TV's and DVD/CD Players were given to the reserve and will be used in the Ranger House and the research Kitchen.

Research and Monitoring

- A re-survey was undertaken of photo points around the reserve, originally set up by Peter Gell of the University of Adelaide.
- A survey of goat movements along the northern boundary was undertaken, preparatory to the construction of an electric exclusion fence.
- Feral Goat control continued throughout the year with the Sporting Shooters culling goats on two occasions.
- Three "Judas" Goats were obtained from Parcoola and fitted with satellite tracking collars to assist with feral animal control.
- Investigations continue into the use of mustering for controlling goat populations.
- A Terms of Reference was produced and adopted by the Research & Monitoring (R&M) Sub-committee.
- Rangers carried out an active program of weed management, concentrating mainly on the homestead paddock.
- The R & M Sub-committee approved a program for 2011 activities including soil mapping by volunteer Tony Meissner.

- Stealth cameras were installed to monitor breeding activity on active Malleefowl Mounds.

Infrastructure

- Heat extractors ("whirly gigs") were installed in the Environmental Education Centre roof.
- A concrete apron was poured at the front of the Squirrel Shed.
- Toilets at Babbler and the Visitor Centre were pumped.
- Friends of Gluepot purchased three Garmin GPS Map 62 units with an NRM Community Volunteers Grant, for use in monitoring activities on the reserve. They will be retained by the rangers.
- Diesel & Gypsum Dams have now been closed and leveled.
- Cat traps were purchased for control of feral animals.
- A Two-way radio system was installed in the Bus.
- All Fire Extinguishers on the reserve were inspected and upgraded where necessary by an external expert. An annual contract has been let to a Waikerie firm to conduct extinguisher inspections.

Research and Monitoring

- PhD Research Student Daniel Hoops completed his study on reptiles entitled "The evolution of cognition in reptiles"
- Seven solar powered ANABAT systems are now active on Gluepot (365 nights per year) to monitor bat movement and behavior. Gluepot is now Australia's first permanent bat recording station.
- Action continued on feral goat control with sporting shooters making two visits two the reserve during the year.
- Consideration is being given (subject to availability of grant money) to the purchase of further collars for Judas Goats.
- The fox baiting program continued with rangers carrying out two "follow up" rounds.
- A project was commenced to monitor the activities of rabbits, concentrating mainly in the Homestead area.
- The Friends of Gluepot surveyed all seven Malleefowl grids seeking to identify active mounds
- A proposal to translocate Black-eared Miners off the reserve was rejected (at this stage) because of the
 possibility of hybridization at the new site. This will be reconsidered if circumstances alter in the future.
- The plant species list for Gluepot was updated using the SA Census of Vascular Plants 2005.
- A new Photocopier/printer was purchased for the committee room. It will facilitate high quality reproduction of material provided to visitors at the Michael Hyde Visitor Centre.

- A feasibility study was commenced into the possibility of building a purpose built library on the reserve adjacent to the committee room.
